North Carolina Coalition Against Domestic Violence CEO Dana Mangum Announces Departure

The NC Coalition Against Domestic Violence (NCCADV) CEO Dana W. Mangum, MA, announced that she will leave her position at NCCADV to lead SHIFT NC, a statewide nonprofit leading North Carolina to improve adolescent and young adult sexual health, as their new CEO.

“I’m very proud of NCCADV’s accomplishments over the past 5 years, and am honored to have represented the organization and its mission,” said Mangum. “I have a profound respect for the incredible staff, and the dedication and support of the board and our partners in addressing intimate partner violence in the state. I have the strongest confidence that the organization is poised to continue to grow and build on its past successes.”

During her time at NCCADV, Mangum led the staff to increase its impact in North Carolina by doubling the number of staff, programs, and the organizational budget. She led work to secure funding to initiate healthcare and housing programs, broaden the coalition’s work to include a social justice lens, initiate intensive internal equity work, encourage a board restructure, while serving on multiple state-level task forces addressing healthcare, housing, and state policy regarding intimate partner violence. She led staff to bring to fruition the ED Leadership Institute, and address and advocate for many state policies and laws addressing intimate partner violence.

NCCADV Interim Board Chair Katie Vance said, “The Board is very appreciative of the tremendous work Dana has done over the past 5 years with NCCADV to lead the state’s movement to end domestic violence. Dana’s skills and leadership led the coalition to strengthen internal equitable practices and position the organization to increase services to survivors of domestic violence.”

North Carolina Coalition Against Domestic Violence CSO Catherine Guerrero Announces Departure

The NCCADV CSO Catherine Guerrero also announced this week that she will leave her position at NCCADV to take a public health consulting position focused on supporting community work to address social determinants of health, as well as ending interpersonal and community violence. Catherine has worked with NCCADV since June 2012, serving as the Prevention Coordinator, Associate Director, and Chief Strategy Officer. Catherine has worked in the domestic violence and sexual assault fields since 1994.

During her tenure at NCCADV, Catherine's major focus has been to improve the strategic approach to organizational work. She has partnered with staff to bring national attention to the programs and products of the organization, and position NCCADV as a leader in the anti-domestic violence movement. Catherine is most proud of this work with staff and can't wait to see where they take it from here.

Agatha Buell Eggers to Fill Interim CEO Role

NCCADV's Board of Directors has asked Agatha Buell Eggers to serve as Interim Executive Director beginning January 26. Agatha has been with the Coalition since 2014, in that time serving as the CFO with a significant role in leadership at the agency. She brings to this role 20 years of experience working with non-profits, as well as a background in Enterprise Risk Management and financial leadership. Agatha is eager to support the Coalition in continuing current initiatives and serving the state well through this transition.
